EXAMPLES

A, E, O, and U usually say their names | at the end, at the end of a syllable.
(Cue Tune: Row, Row, Row Your Boat)

Silent final E, silent final E | English has five reasons for a silent final E:

To let the vowel say its name;

You can't end a word in U or V;

Lets C and G say /S/ and /J/;

Ev'ry syllable must have a vowel;

No job E. *(Cue Tune: The Farmer In The Dell)*

**Words ending in one of the five silent E's are
written without the E before a vowel suffix.**

(Cue Tune: Itsy Bitsy Spider)
