*3 new spelling rules and 6 grammar rules are set to music and
sung on the DVDs for you and your student to sing.*

EXAMPLES

**All, full, and till; all, full, and till; Are written with only one L when joined
to another syllable, All, full, and till.**
(Cue: Three Blind Mice)

I-e or e-i. which one do we use, I-e or e-i, let me give you clues.

Use **e-i** after **c** and when it says **ay**, Also in some **other** words, **this** is what
they say:

**“Neither weird foreign sovereign forfeited leisure (by) seizing either
heifer’s counterfeit protein.”**

(Cue: Rain, Rain, Go Away)

GRAMMAR TUNES

EXAMPLES

Who is speaking, who is speaking, I alone, I alone

I with another makes the plural ‘we’, I and we, I and we.

To whom are you speaking, to whom are you speaking, you alone, you alone

You with another is you in the plural, you and you, you and you.

About whom are your speaking, about whom are you speaking,

He or she or it when speaking of one.

Together with another you get the plural ‘they’

He and they, she and they, it and they.

(Cue: Are You Sleeping?)
